- 3) Survey the Marina canal bank and Island Point Rd roadway for erosion and roadway stability. (L&T Engineering)
- 4) Survey and repair cul-de-sac drainage across and under #102 Lazy River Rd., which includes under the driveway, the house and seawall.

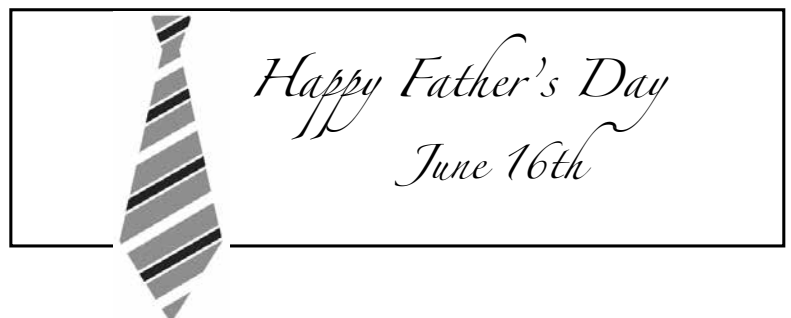

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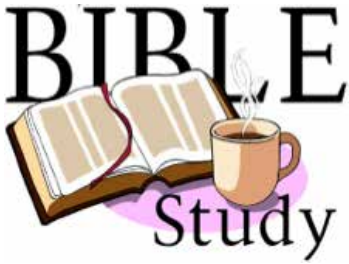
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**GOOD/EVIL OR

Hello Everyone!

Do you know the monthly full moon names? I know you have heard of some of them, and going forward, when discussing lunar events, I will refer to it as such.

January: Wolf Moon	July: Buck Moon
February: Snow Moon	August: Sturgeon Moon
March: Worm Moon	September: Full Corn Moon
April: Pink Moon	October: Hunter's Moon
May: Flower Moon	November: Beaver Moon
June: Strawberry Moon	December: Cold Moon

The months of May and June will show us the last two "Super Moons" for 2021. A super moon happens when a full moon reaches the perigee, which is the point in the orbit of the Moon when it's closest to earth. The dates for these Supers are May 26th (Super Flower Moon) and June 24th (Super Strawberry Moon). At those times, the moon will be approximately 30% brighter and 14% bigger to an earthling observer. Catch these views as the moon rises in the east on those dates and it will

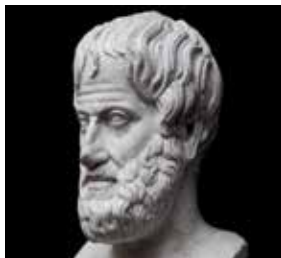

appear to some as even a bit bigger, as it is close to the horizon. However, the perception of a larger moon near the horizon is an illusion, truly all in your mind. Although there is some refractive effect of the atmosphere, it is very small. That will change the color, but not the apparent size. Only the proximity of the moon distance to the earth can affect that. Do you feel snookered by that lunar trickery? Well, don't feel too bad - Aristotle was fooled by that the same thing!
