Golf – Couples League



In previous years, Lazy River Couples Golf has started the season at Waterford Golf Course in October. Although Waterford again offered us tee times this October, unfortunately we did not have enough golfers to complete even two foursomes. Many of our snowbirds have advised me that they do want to play when they return to Lazy River but their arrival is dependent on the ongoing battle against Covid-19 and/or the opening of the Canadian-U.S. border. A few golfers have advised me that they do plan to return to Lazy River Village in November so I am hopeful that by the time this article is published, I will be scheduling tee times for our group.

As indicated in the October Current. Waterford Golf Course will provide our group with tee times on Sunday afternoons for the same green fee that we have paid in recent years, \$25.00 plus tax for 9 holes. We will be expected to ride two people in a cart, separated by a protective barrier. There would be a charge of \$5 if you prefer to ride alone.

The format is a scramble, i.e., each person takes their own shot but the foursome plays from the best shot. A drive from each member of the foursome must be used at least once during the game. This season there will be a membership fee of \$10. John Overton and I handle the group's finances and organize the End-of-Season party held near the end of March with the 9 Hole Golf group. We will start collecting membership fees whenever one of us returns to Lazy River Village. Although I do not expect to arrive in Lazy River before January, I will handle the scheduling of tee times through e-mail. We also want to welcome new residents to LRV. Want to meet new people and get a little fun exercise in the process? There is no better way than playing Pickleball at LRV.

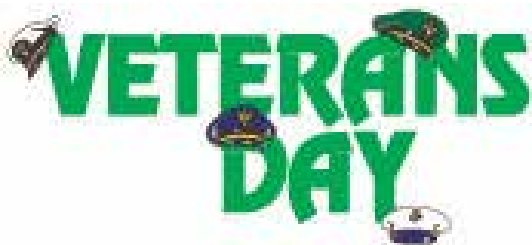
We have several spare paddles, balls, nets, courts and many players very good at teaching the game! You name it, we got it.
