The Perfect Storm. I am sure many of you have read the book or have watched the movie. But there is another "Perfect Storm" brewing, and it's called the Real Estate Market. Over the course of my 37+



years as a Realtor, most conversations have the question, "How's the Market?" in them. Since the pandemic and the market's rapid escalation, part of the question is "When is the Market Going Down?" and the answer is (for full disclosure, I don't have a crystal ball to gaze into) I don't believe for a while, and the reason is "The Perfect Storm."

There are 5 components that are creating "The Perfect Storm." The first is we have historically low interest rates. Granted they are creeping up right now (as of the date of this writing 2.12.2022 they are around 3.5% for a 30 year fixed mortgage), they are still low. I started out in Real Estate in 1984, they were in the middle teens, so comparatively speaking, they are extremely low. It's also relative, banks are paying little to nothing on deposit accounts. In the past you would get 6% on a NOW Checking Account and a free Toaster for opening the account.

The second factor is that we have a national shortage of housing units. The experts, estimate it to be a number around or possibly greater than 5,000,000! This is attributed to the shortage of new construction. Nationwide, we were predicted to be short prior to the high pace of 2005 and 2006. After the crash of 2008, builders were slow to pick up again. Today in 2022 we are still not building at the pace we were in the mid 2000's. The material and supply shortage, as well as the labor shortage, are continuing to be problematic.

Third, The Baby Boomer population. More than 67 million U.S. homeowners are over the age of 55 according to Freddie Mac. Many are not moving, and some are moving but they are taking up rentals. This is significant because of their ability to pay higher rents than those that are starting out and are saddled with student loan debt. This is also the

segment of the population which has been and is paying cash or financing only a small portion of the purchase.

Fourth, the next largest population group, the Millennials, which top out at a number of 40,000,000 are entering the housing market in 2022 and this trend will continue for several years to come. We are already experiencing an inventory crisis, and this large group is just getting started.

Lastly, the fifth ingredient if you will, is the fact that we are in a global pandemic. This time, people panicked and moved. When they moved, they moved to places of "comfort." This is enabled by the fact that virtually the whole Country went to a "work at home" model and it seems to be working. Many folks have returned to work, but many are able to work remotely, so they can live where they want, without changing jobs. Sounds pretty appealing.

As for the market crashing, it is unlikely unless there is some natural or other disaster. The reason I say this is the number of cash sales, particularly in Sarasota County, is staggering! For example, in Sarasota County in December 2021, the number of manufactured homes that closed was 52. Out of that 52, 50 were cash sales! A staggering number for sure.





Pickleball

Watch your partner as they hit the third shot of the game, if they stay back, remain with them, if they advance forward, move up with them.

We encourage anyone who would like to work on skills, to organize some practice time to prepare for our pickleball tournament. Players can sign up for the March 12 Pickleball tournament starting March 1 at the courts during scheduled playing time. A cookout and award ceremony will be held after the tournament.

The Current Sky with the Telescope Guy

Hello again!

This month the dance of four planets will be an interesting visual in the early morning sky, but your timing will be important as they are lost in the dawn's glow shortly. For the March 2nd view (Figure 1), you will need an unobstructed south-eastern horizon to see well. Island Point, the bottom loop of Martinique or the end of Lazy River Road seems a good bet over the water. If you have one morning only, then March 28th (Figure 2) is the time for you. Along with the three planets forming a right triangle, you have the waning crescent of the Worm Moon shining below.

March 2022 marks 55 years since I became interested in Astronomy and pursued it lifelong. My uncle worked as a technician in the Adler Planetarium in Chicago, and I had traveled there with him many times on the weekends to just revel in what it had to offer me. That month, my uncle's work colleague loaned him a 4-1/4-inch telescope and I fell in love with it. During cold nights I was out there for hours, viewing objects that I have never seen before. As I was a boy scout, the Astronomy Merit Badge was easy-peezze for me to obtain. Over the next year or so, I decided on what my Eagle Scout Project would be; I decided to build a six-inch reflector telescope, with main part of the project being the laying out the overall configuration and then making the most important part of the telescope with my own hands - the primary mirror.

The Adler had a telescope makers workshop behind glass windows, so I took it on. The grinding, polishing, testing and correcting of the mirror from a flat Pyrex glass disk to a concave spherical, then parabolical surface took me about 100 hours of work. It ended up being a very fine mirror, with the final steps removing only a few millionths of an inch to transform the spherical surface to the required paraboloid in order to focus the light properly.

In August of 1968 then, I hitched a ride into Chicago with my older cousin to finish the final steps on the

mirror. That was the day we were going to apply a reflective aluminum coating on the mirror, and with that complete my scout project, fulfilling all Eagle Scout requirements before my fourteenth birthday. Sadly, we didn't get to the planetarium on August 25th, 1968, and the machine for applying the coating broke before I could finish the project by my birthday. What caused our delay on that fateful day, you ask? Curiosity, plain and simple! We diverted to Grant Park that day, as there were traffic snarls and many protesters out.

It was late in the day, so we found parking and blew off the Adler stop. It was a crazy scene in Grant Park, and something in the later evening Chicago's Finest came out with Billy clubs and teargas. We ran like hell and got out of there, coughing and running with the pack! At any rate, the scout project was successful and led me down the path to here. How is that, you ask? I am a firm believer that any event or sequence, no matter how tiny or obscure in one's life, if different, would have changed one's entire life and the path. So, I understand how I arrived at Lazy River, and you must as well too!
