Greetings to all of our Lazy River residents, wherever you are. What a difference a month makes, for in the October Current I spoke of how beautiful the community was looking after the summer rains, and we were looking forward to the return of our friends and neighbors. Little did we know of the disaster to come, as Ian ravaged the gulf side of the state and left our village in shambles. The devastation left in its path is indescribable, and left everyone in a state of shock. This community, which was established in the mid-seventies, has never encountered anything like this. Previously, the odds were in our favor, since we had never had a major weather event like Ian, and damages have always been minimal.



This is uncharted territory for all of us, and there are more questions than answers, which is very unsettling, especially for those folks who lost everything. Our hearts go out to all in our

community who have major decisions to make going forward.

I believe all of us discovered that our insurance, if we had it, is woefully deficient, when it comes to processing claims and the amount of coverage as a result of wind damage from a hurricane. We are all paying exorbitant rates that don't even come close to replacement value, and we experienced many exclusions with our LRV corporate insurance as well. It will be interesting to see what the state does come next year, when I suspect even more providers will be pulling out of Florida.

The Lazy River community is resilient, and we will recover from this; it may take years, but it will happen, and we will be stronger because of

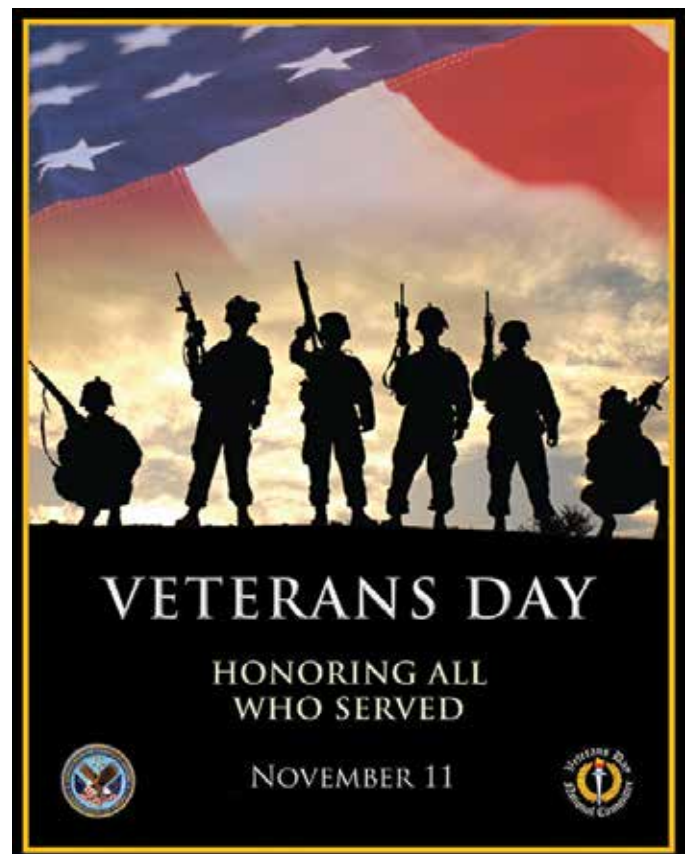

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## The Current Sky with the Telescope Guy – November 2022

Hello again!

So much has happened in the last month to our village; it would be easy to look at our own problems and not worry about others, but that is not the way of Lazy River Village. First, the good news is we didn't lose anyone. Secondly, we have had many in the village working tirelessly to clean up the debris and help one another. Although I haven't been with you the past month, my heart has been with every single one of you, and hopefully, by the time you read this, I will be on site and I will help with what I can do, too.

I am not sure whether people are looking to the normalcy we usually have just yet, but this and other articles can take our minds off the troubles we are all sharing. That said, let's look at the November sky:

The Moon continues to play cat and mouse with three planets in the evening and morning sky:

November 1, Tuesday: The waxing moon will have a visit with post-opposition (maximum brightness) yellowish Saturn, almost directly overhead, closing to about 4-1/2 degrees from the moon at or about 730 pm. A fine easy pair to identify.

November 4, Friday: Tonight, the Lunar rendezvous is with the bright planet Jupiter, being less than 3 degrees between the two - that's about three moon diameters.

November 11, Friday: At morning twilight, we will find Mars and the waning Moon making the closest encounter of the planets this month - 2-1/2 degrees from each other. If you have binoculars, the ruddy red color of Mars will contrast with the grey lunar disk. Should be a good view.

The two telescopes that I have down in LRV give fine views. The big 10 inch Newtonian has worked well, but higher magnification for planetary viewing is more challenging due to the faster focal length. You just don't get a lot of magnification out of this device, but it offers bright contrasty views.

My plan is to bring an 11 inch slower focal length telescope down with me, along with its motorized tracking mount. This instrument, along with Jupiter being high in the sky, should provide nice views of the planet's belts and moons.

We will leave the big 14 inch at home, for now!
