feast offered the stimulus for much of the fund raising that has totaled over \$20,000. Beautification worked tirelessly, sometimes seven days a week, to haul scrap metal to the dump, one load at a time, returning all the proceeds to the village. I'm amazed, but not surprised. I would be remiss if I didn't mention the skilled workers who worked so hard on the vinyl fence that secures our storage lot. Your work is incredible, and you have saved us thousands of dollars by your efforts.

On November 11th, a memorial service was held at Veterans Island, honoring those who served in our armed forces. The keynote speaker was (3 star) Lt. General William T. Lord, USAF (retired), who is the brother-in-law of Larry and Pat Krome on Lazy River Road. His presence made the veteran ceremony extra special. As always, the service was well attended by residents, and it was followed by a luncheon in the clubhouse. Thanks to Bob Stanko, who organized the event and luncheon.

The Lazy River Boat Club sponsored a Thanksgiving dinner at the clubhouse, prepared by Gary Lynch and company. The event was sold out, and it generated approximately \$2,500 in donations toward the disaster fund. Thanks to all who worked so hard to make this happen. Wherever you were, I hope you had a wonderful celebration, for we all have a lot to be thankful for in spite of the challenges we face.

As of February 9th, there will be 4 openings on the Lazy River Board of Directors, so if you feel so inclined to give of your time and talent, I encourage you to submit your resume before the deadline for candidates. Who will step up to the plate and fill these leadership roles?

The holidays are fast approaching, and I wish each and every one of you, a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year. 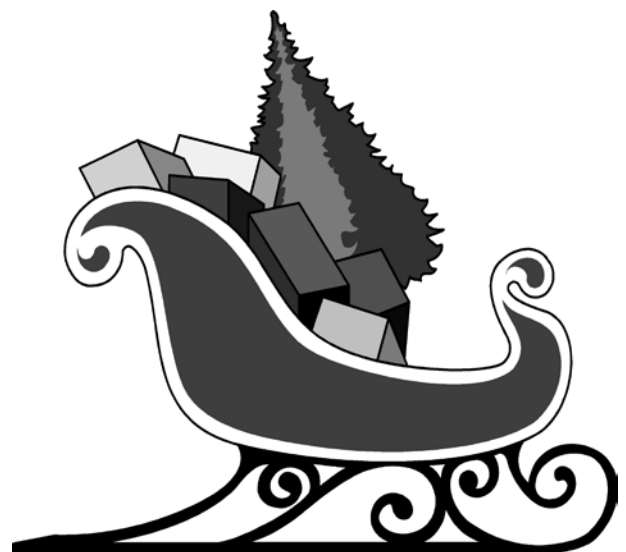
## Managers's Report *(continued from page 1)*

## Realtor's Report

Emotions, Fright, Devastation, Community, Loss, Heroes. These are just a few words that in my opinion sum up the experiences and feelings we all have had during the horrific storm called Hurricane Ian. None of us will ever forget. Our homes, our community, devastated. There are no other words to describe it.



Whether you were at home in Lazy River Village or at your summer place, we all feel the effects of the storm. In the past weeks since the storm I have received many phone calls from members of our community. Some just wondering what was left, if anything, of their home. Some looking to figure out what the next step is going to be.

I can't help but thinking of my own experience. Thinking "I am strong, I can weather the storm in place" turned quickly the morning of Tuesday when I made the decision to evacuate. Quickly gathering my belongings and going to get my son and dog at Florida Gulf Coast University in Fort Myers. Waiting and wondering. Then coming back after the storm. Like anyone else in that position, the following days were painful. Our community, our slice of heaven, destroyed.

The one profound thing that I have realized since the news of the storm is the sense of Community. Neighbors helping neighbors, strangers helping strangers. I often ask myself, why does it take a disaster to see the goodness in mankind? Shouldn't we all act like this every day? What a wonderful world it would be if we all showed a sense of compassion for all others.

Where do we go from here? As we continue the cleanup and begin rebuilding, it will be evident that some will end up leaving our community. However, I have noticed that people are still looking to move to the area. Historically, areas hit by a major weather event, tend to see a rise in value in the following year.

The real estate market nationally is seeing a "shift." Some areas that saw a rapid escalation in demand and value are starting to see that taper off. We

all know that the Covid pandemic changed many things. While it is too early to tell, what will come of the Southwest FL real estate market in the months to follow, we cannot look at what is happening to our National economy. Interest rates have doubled in the past few months, inflation is rising at historical levels, and still, there is a housing shortage that continues to plague the market. Starting now and going into next year, the millennial population will be entering the housing market. That will have a direct correlation to real estate at Lazy River Village. The demand that this will create will afford folks the opportunity to sell their home somewhere else and buy in our Community. # Over the Counter

Otc hearing aids are for people who only have a mild loss. In the 15 years we have been in business we have only met four people who would have been a good fit for these hearing aids. Their audiogram looks like a straight or slight dip in a line near the top. These aren't for anyone whose loss looks like a ski slope in the middle of the range.

Why are these otc hearing aids only good for so few people? The small range otc aids can fit.

Research shows that people are aware of their hearing loss for over seven years before they take action. By the time they seek help their loss has deteriorated into a moderate to severe loss range. This type of loss would not benefit from otc hearing aids.

The good news is with otc hearing aids people might seek help sooner. And doing so they may retain more comprehension. Waiting to get help reduces someone's ability to grasp the meanings of the words in the conversation.

Other great news is hearing aids no longer have the stigma they once had. A few decades ago, everyone wanted the smallest, most discreet in-the-canal hearing aid, so no-one would know they were wearing hearing aids. The tiny size limited who could wear them with quality results. These weren't a good fit if you hear low frequency well, they weren't a good fit if you spent time in crowds.

Again, the good news is wearing hearing aids no longer has the stigma it once did. And people might get something for their hearing loss sooner and retain more of their comprehension ability.

Will otc hearing aids replace us? No. Just as cheater readers have not replaced opticians.

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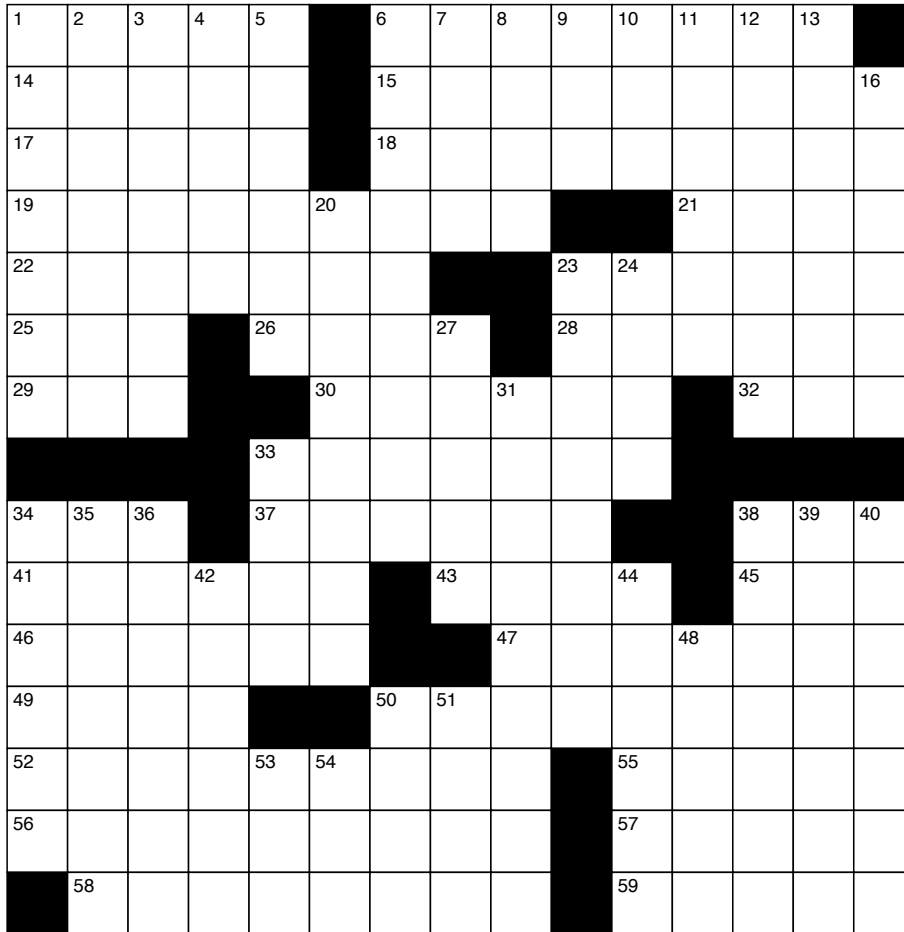

# The Current Sky – DECEMBER 2022

Hello again!

We finally arrived back in LRV on November 1st and were amazed with the work performed by our volunteers and how much has been done after the hurricane. I cannot express my appreciation enough for the help given to us by LRV's best prior to our arrival!

Let's talk about the most significant astronomical event coming for December:

December 7th, Wednesday, after sunset,  
going forward

This is the most special event of the month, a "near" occultation, or grazing, of Mars and the Moon at the LRV location. Many areas of the country will see a full disappearance of Mars behind the Moon, only to reappear again on the other side hours later. For us, we will see Mars just minutes from the Moon's edge at its closest approach, rather than an occultation. The red planet is near full brilliance for the period and the Moon will be full that evening as well.

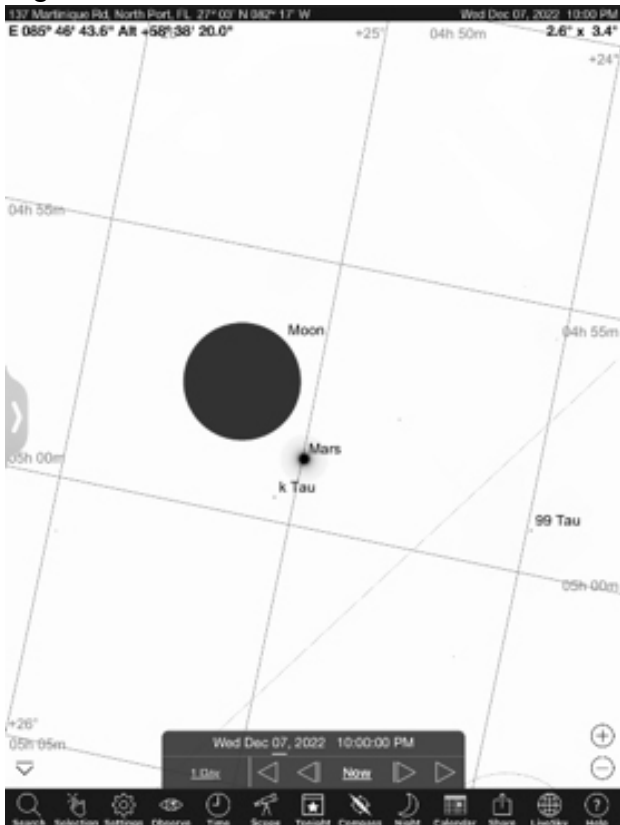


Figure 1 below, shows apparent separation {less than actually depicted} time. Figure 2 shows a dark line which is the line of occultation threshold. For instance, if you look at Boston area on the map, you see it is on the bold line. Boston does not get an occultation, only a grazing, like us, but in that location, it will be separated by only 1 minute of angle, so Mars will appear to "skitter" along the Moon's edge for a time. The rest of the country, above the bold line, gets the occultation.

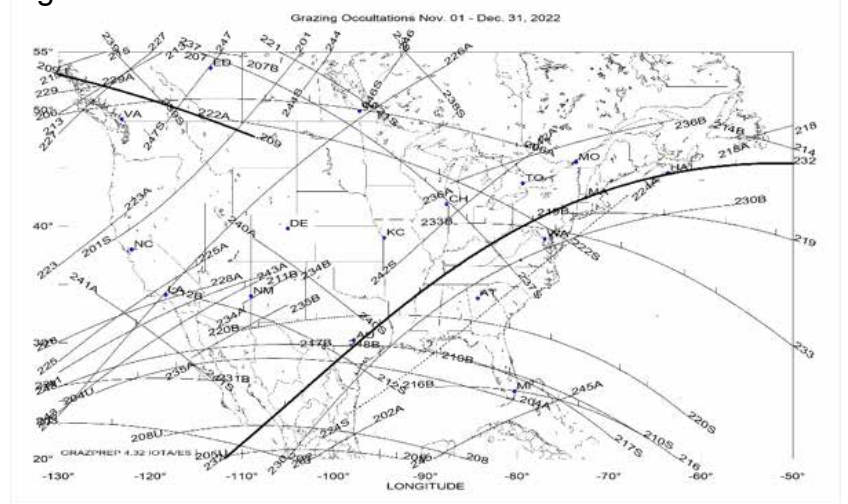
This is a must see and I will be setting up for this event with several telescopes, weather permitting. Additional information will go out the week before to get you ready for this view! OBTW, Jupiter is high in the night sky and will provide contrasty telescopic views as well.
