a few properties have let this go over the summer. Even if your home needs repairs, or even if it is a vacant lot, we do expect that the homesite will be maintained. Speaking of repairs, as we are past the one-year anniversary of Hurricane Ian, we will be following up with owners of homes that visibly need exterior repairs to understand what the plans are. We do understand the contractor's delays and nightmare of getting contractors scheduled. We are not imposing dates for repairs to be completed but we do want to know that a plan does exist.

It is critical for the village to reinstate the Beautification volunteers on Monday morning to help with what I will call project work. Beautification will focus on reinstating this activity in the fall. This will be a big help to the community as they can engage in many activities to help with the appearance of the park (pressure washing, painting, mulching, trimming, smaller construction projects, etc.).

In past years, the volunteers provided help that was beyond the equivalent of a full-time person all focused on the appearance of the park. Please consider helping!

Our front gates have been a nightmare this summer with numerous problems. We have a contract in place to fully replace the access control mechanism. We will no longer have stickers and cards but instead a fob to push a button to open the gates (like a garage door opener). There will still be punch codes to open the gate as well as the ability to place a call and be buzzed in. Furthermore, residents with a smart phone will have the ability to open the gate from their phone, as well as set up temporary guest codes to be punched in (for deliveries, contractors, renters, guests). This will be a significant change for the community as we bring in newer technology and work through the transition. I hope everyone will remain patient through the transition and I do hope by the time you read this the transition will have started.






