# Getting yelled at?

Do you think that your spouse is yelling at you more often than usual? If you said yes, you are not alone in this. We recently had George come in and asked for adjustments to his hearing aids. I ask why and he said, "my wife is yelling at me morning and night."



The Idea of Echo is to offer help to all residents, including renters, creating a culture of neighbor helping neighbor. It is also a way of getting to know your neighbors.

Looking toward to the future, we are in need volunteers. The volunteers can choose how much time to be available and/or schedule specific days. Contact The Chair with questions or requests for registration forms.

# The Current Sky with the **Telescope Guy**

- FEBRUARY 2024

Hello, again!

I tend to discuss evening events for this article, as that's when I usually observe. So for this month:

February 14th: The moon, in its waxing crescent stage, will have a close encounter with the bright planet Jupiter. Jupiter will be slightly to the east of the moon, and as the evening progresses, they will come as close as 3 degrees. It should be a pretty visual sight.

February 16th: A small constellation of stars, known as the Pleiades, or Seven Sisters, will be within 3-1/2 degrees from the moon (actually, one of the Sisters - Alcyone). If you have binoculars, this would be a good place to use them to point out the other six Sisters nearby. The moon is quite bright, so you will have to look carefully.

Next month, we will talk about the upcoming total eclipse of the Sun, which occurs in April. I observed the 2017 total eclipse, dodging clouds all over south and eastern Nebraska before I had a place with a clear view. It was a phenomenal view, and this one in April will be far longer in duration. Till next time, Clear Skies and Good Health!


