Going forward, we will need to keep a close eye on our operational cash. At the end of January, we have less than three months of expenses covered in our operational cash. Ideally, we would like to have 6 months' worth of expenses on hand in case of unexpected expenses. And we will have significant insurance premiums due around July 1. While I think we will be fine, operational funds are tight and we will need to keep a close eye on it. It is important to note that we cannot combine Reserve Funds with our Operational Cash.

We are nearing the roll out of a new village website, and it does look very sharp. This is in conjunction with a new office database that will be fully integrated with the website, eliminating the maintenance of data in multiple locations. The new website should correct some of the issues all of us have been having with the current site. The Electronic Process Committee continues to do outstanding work.

We are continuing to work with homeowners to improve their properties and the overall appearance of the village. We are following up on homes needing globe light repairs, power washing, weeding, etc. As well as ensuring homes that need repairs of some sort have a plan in place for the repairs needed. Monthly inspections in the storage yard have started to ensure spaces do not have debris and that the vehicles/trailers/vessels stored are indeed appropriately registered with the office.

Lastly, as we now have the new BOD in place, I want to sincerely thank Bob Stanko for all his work over the past two years. And I would like to welcome Ray Thompson to the BOD.


strenuous than Pickleball or Tennis.





The Current Sky with the Telescope Guy –

MARCH 2024

Hello again!

I tend to discuss evening events for this article, as that's when I usually observe. So for this month:

March 13th: One of the best sights this month will occur in the western sky as dusk begins. A thin waxing crescent of the Moon will be there, along with the planet Jupiter, within 3 degrees. Binoculars will make for a nice view of the two of them.

March 24th: Mercury will make its appearance low on the western horizon just after sunset. Binoculars are helpful here, but if you have an unobstructed sky you will see it with your eye alone. A good place to view it is Venice Beach, or the Pier there. Jupiter will be brighter and higher, above and two the left.

Get ready for the 2024 Total Eclipse on April 8th! This will be a great one to see, as it will be well over four minutes in length. Lodging accommodations will be hard to find and expensive, so if you have access to an RV, it is to your advantage to drive to a location and view. Below, is a figure of the eclipse's path across the United States. Next month, some last-minute items regarding the eclipse and more.

TORNADOES

- Purchase a NOAA Weather Radio and/or a batterypowered commercial radio and extra batteries.
- Many mobile phones are capable of receiving Wireless Emergency Alerts (WEAs). These alerts can inform you about life-threatening weather conditions in your immediate area.
- Know the terms used to describe tornado threats:
 - a. "<u>Tornado Watch</u>" Tornadoes are possible. Remain alert for approaching storms.
 - b. "<u>Tornado Warning</u>" A tornado has been sighted or indicated by weather radar. Take shelter immediately if a Tornado Warning is issued for your area.
- If a tornado threatens, seek shelter in a small, windowless interior room or hallway on the lowest level of a sturdy building.
- Mobile homes are not safe during tornadoes.
 Abandon mobile homes and go to the nearest sturdy building immediately.
- If you are caught outdoors, seek shelter in a sturdy building, NOT a mobile home or portable structure.
- 7. If you cannot quickly walk to a sturdy building, immediately get into a vehicle, buckle your seat belt, and try to drive to the closest sturdy building. Take pillows/blankets with you.
- If flying debris occurs while you are driving, pull over and park. Now you have the following options as a last resort:
 - Stay in your vehicle with the seat belt on. Put your head down below the windows, covering with your hands and a blanket if possible.
 - b. If you can safely get noticeably lower than the level of the roadway, exit your car, and lie in that area, covering your head with your hands.


